In Costa Rica, the government through OGP restart consultations with indigenous communities on service delivery which created a relationship that resulted in better health and education services. Schools become transparent to improve quality and efficiency

The Kigoma Ujiji Municipal Council publishes data on school funding and expenditures, student and staff numbers, school labor needs, school building infrastructure and test results to help identify and target unequipped and underperforming schools.

Silver Kin

Providing health services for citizens.

Buenos Aires created a comprehensive and public database containing information on the availability of sexual and reproductive health services, and a geolocation map of the centers to increase access to their services.

Citizens participating in budgets.

Côte d'Ivoire engaged women's groups in participatory budgeting to help set priorities and fund public services that better respond to their needs.

Partnership to provide sanitation facilities

Sekondi-Takoradi Government, Ghana is bringing together landlords, private sector and citizens to improve sanitation by building toilets in all properties.
